## **Profile**

Carl S. Richie, Jr. is vice president of government affairs at TXU Energy, a competitive retail business which serves more than 2 million residential, commercial and industrial customers. TXU Energy is a subsidiary of Energy Future Holdings Corp.



Richie leads the company's state legislative and regulatory teams and is responsible for the development and implementation of strategy in the legislative and regulatory arenas. He also manages TXU Energy's employee-based political action committee and associated activities.

Prior to joining TXU Energy in June 2008, Richie concentrated his legal practice in the areas of administrative law and legislative representation. His clients included corporations, municipalities, non-profit associations and trade associations on legislative matters before the Texas legislature.

Richie represented several energy and customer-focused companies before state and federal regulatory agencies, including energy clients, before the Public Utility Commission of Texas in rate-related cases, rulemakings and other regulatory proceedings. He has also represented generators, retail electric providers and clients with power marketing applications before the Federal Energy Regulation Commission.

Richie has authored numerous articles and has served as speaker at conferences concerning legislative and legal issues.

Richie has received awards and recognition as a result of his involvement in numerous civic, affordable housing, legal and legislative organizations.
